CarolAnn has written a book about her world adventure titled "Upon Silver Wings". Forty-six people attended her slide show presentation, representing the Airpark, the local EAA chapter, CAPA, and the Eastern New England chapter of the 99s. CarolAnn, wrote, paid for publication and copies of all books out of her personal monies. All proceeds from book sales go directly to ALS-TDF research and are tax deductible. CarolAnn had two extra fuel tanks installed, one 50 gallon and one 20 gallon tank in order to make a 15 hour leg across the Pacific Ocean from California to Hawaii. She had to remove both her back seat and her copilot seat to accommodate them. She spent 15 hours flying nonstop during one leg of her journey! CarolAnn said the most difficult was crossing the Indian Ocean due to lack of communication.


